Déclaration de solidarité avec le peuple kenyan

En tant que membres du Réseau international pour les droits économiques, sociaux et culturels (Réseau DESC), nous souhaitons exprimer par la présente notre profonde solidarité avec le peuple kenyan en cette période inquiétante. Nous dénonçons la violence qui a éclaté partout au pays à la suite d'un processus électoral douteux, et exprimons notre sincère sympathie à tous ceux et celles qui ont souffert et continuent de souffrir des conséquences malheureuses de ces hostilités, en particulier les plus vulnérables qui sont les principales victimes des agressions. Nous sommes consternés par le grand nombre de personnes déplacées de leur foyer et de leurs terres, et dont plusieurs ont été victimes de violence fondée sur le sexe et perdu l'accès aux soins hospitaliers, aux médicaments et aux vivres de base. De plus, nous condamnons vivement les restrictions aux libertés d'expression, d'assemblée et d'association des Kenyans moyens, entre autres violations des droits humains. Nous exigeons, par la présente, une solution rapide, juste et pacifique à l'actuel climat de répression et de brutalité. Finalement, nous encourageons vivement les Kenyans à maintenir la paix et la tranquillité et à assurer la justice et une coexistence pacifique alors qu'on recherche une solution acceptable à cette impasse.

Le Réseau DESC œuvre à promouvoir et faire avancer les droits économiques, sociaux et culturels par le biais d'alliances de travail collectif entre ses 138 membres, qui regroupent des mouvements sociaux, des groupes de base, des organisations autochtones et des ONG du monde entier. Nous appuyons et continuerons à servir nos partenaires du Kenya à travers cette période éprouvante, en particulier en défendant et en renforçant la réalisation des droits humains en tant qu'élément essentiel pour assurer la dignité de toutes et tous les Kenyans, et en luttant contre la violence structurelle de la pauvreté et des inégalités qui continuent à menacer la vie et les moyens de subsistance des peuples.
